The criteria for listing a boat name on the "Memorial Wall" are as follows:

- Must be a Dory Association member in good standing.
- Vessel must be a traditional single or double-ended dory
  - Traditional dory defined as: a small boat up to 28' long that is generally flat bottomed but may have a semi-V hull.
  - A dory typically has an open cockpit or sometimes a small cabin and usually has a stand up control console.
  - This boat is designed to be pushed, rowed and/or motored into and through the Pacific surf to the sea. May have some, or pronounced bow rake.
  - Boat can be built of wood, wood/fiberglass, fiberglass, composite, or aluminum.
  - Boat can be considered as commercial, charter or recreational.
- Must have called Cape Kiwanda at Pacific City its home port.
- Must have repeatedly negotiated Pacific City's surf any time from 1930 to the present.
- Any disagreement concerning eligibility of any boat name will be examined by the Board of Directors who will consult with a committee of at least 3 known authorities appointed by the Board to investigate the disagreement. Appropriate Bills of Sale, Boat Registrations, Boat Titles, photos or other documents will be considered proof, as well as sworn and documented testimony.

This is the "Official form" for adding a "New Name" or "Corrected Spelling" of a Dory to the Memorial Wall.
